The Spirit of Christmas

In November, Harkins Elementary commenced participation in the District's annual food drive to support our local food bank during the busy season of Christmas. This initiative will conclude on Friday, December 14th. We believe that it is so important for children to learn at an early age the value of helping others, and to realize that we can make a difference in the lives of others through small but significant gestures.

Math Makes Sense

Currently, we are continuing work on our "Numbers to 100" unit. You can help your child at home by doing with them some of the following activities, as suggested in the "Math Makes Sense" teachers' quide:

- Help your child count forward and backward by 2s, 5s, and 10s.
- 2. Place six pennies in a row. Ask your child: "How many pennies are there?" Add a dime to the row and ask: "How much money is there altogether?" Continue using dimes to count until you reach 96 cents.
- 3. Line up ten things in a row, such a spoons, forks, cups, or plates. Ask your child: "What is third? Fifth? Ninth?"
- 4. Gather a collection of about forty small objects for your child to count, such as toys or pennies. Ask your child to count the collection by grouping the objects in different ways.
- 5. Select a number between 50 and 100. Ask your child to draw a picture for the number and then show you how many groups of 10, and how many 1s.
